Great Lent and Holy Week

At the end of April we will be in Holy Week and once again on the threshold of Great and Holy Pascha, the Feast of Feasts! Beginning on the evening of Palm Sunday and continuing through the evening of Holy Tuesday, the Orthodox Church observes a special service known as the Service of the Bridegroom. Each evening service is the Matins or Orthros service of the following day (e.g. the service held on Monday evening is the Orthros service for HolyTuesday). The service is named after the figure of the Bridegroom in the parable of the Ten Virgins (Matthew 25:1-13.) The term Bridegroom calls to mind the intimate closeness of love. It is significant that the Kingdom of God is compared to a bridal feast and a bridal chamber. The Christ of the Passion is the divine **Bridegroom of the Church**. The imagery suggests the final union of the Lover and the beloved. The title Bridegroom also suggests the second coming, the Parousia. In Holy Tradition, the parable is a symbol of the Second Coming; and speaks to the need for constant spiritual vigilance, watchfulness and preparedness. Armed with these practices, developed in our Christian life of fasting, prayer and almsgiving, we are enabled to keep the divine commandments and receive the blessings of the age to come. The apolytikion "Behold the Bridegroom comes at midnight...", which is sung at the beginning of the Orthros of Great Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, reminds the faithful of that essential command; to watch and wait for the Lord, who will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. May your fast be blessed and fruitful!

FUNERAL - On March 7, at Clacton cemetery chapel, Father Mark served the funeral for long time friend of the parish ADAMOS ATHANSSIOU, who reposed in the Lord at the end of February, aged 93, after a long struggle with dementia and failing health. He was lovingly and faithfully cared for at home throughout these long, often difficult years by his daughter Dawn and son Chris, with help from health and social care professionals. Project Committee - The Project Committee has agreed a contract with well known heritage builders Bakers of Danbury to carry out a survey and repairs to the roof and to restore the Victorian parquet and tile floor inside the church. Various other repairs, such as to internal areas of plaster will also be made. We expect the roof survey to commence soon and the other more disruptive work after Holy Pascha. This phase will be followed by more electrical work, including a security (CCTV) system, porch lighting and power outlets around the church.

Iconostasis - The process of staining and oiling our iconostasis is pretty well finished. The stains and oils used bring out the beautiful grain and carved details in the oak structure. The six large icons (Christ, Theotokos, the Archangels Gabriel and Michael, St Martin and The Forerunner) are nearly complete and we hope may be installed early in April. We ask for your continued prayers for a successful conclusion as the final details are completed. Please pray for Silviu our carpenter and for Sophronia our iconographer, and their families. Holy Saint Martin, pray to God for us!
