

Our Appeal was, you will remember, for the sum of £200,000 - leaving nearly £50,000 to be raised.

This still a lot of money, and we shall see whether God answers our prayers in due course. There is not the urgency to raise the last amount, since we cam take our time completing the church. Indeed some of the fitting out can be done over a period of years.

We would like to get the heating done early on, so that we can use St Martin's even in the winter.

We also hope to get the iconostasis installed early on, as that will set the 'tone' or 'atmosphere' of the building to visitors and to worshippers alike. It will also mean we can make secure the altar and the vestry behind it.

ST THEODORE OF TARSUS & CANTERBURY is Patron of our

He called Church councils, started schools and colleges and was much involved in civic life, bringing peace between warring lords and kings. His influence is still felt in British Christianity and civil life. He reposed on 19 September 690, and we celebrate his feast with a Holy Liturgy at 9.30 am.

### A Word from the Fathers on "Our Lady's Birthday'

his is the summary of the benefits of Christ for us. This is the unveiling of the mystery, this is nature made new, God and man, and the deification of the human nature assumed by God.

But so radiant, so glorious a visitation of God to men needed some prelude of joy to introduce to us the great gift of salvation.

The present feast is such: the prelude is the birth of the Mother of God, and the concluding act is the union which is destined between the Word and human nature.

A virgin is now born and suckled and moulded, and is made ready to be mother of God, the king of all for ever.

Justifiably then is the mystery of this day to be celebrated, since a double gain will be ours if we do so; we shall be led towards the Truth, and we shall be led away from a life of slavery to the letter of the law.

How will this be? Clearly, inasmuch as the shadow yields to the presence of the light, and grace introduces freedom in place of the letter.

The present feast stands on the border between these: it joins us to the truth instead of signs and figures, and it brings in the new in place of the old.
