Unfortunately the date for purchase is again being put back-probably until early in 2020. We have asked again if we can have it earlier "on licence", and we await hearing the answer.

In preparation for the new situation of owning a building, there will be an Extraordinary General Meeting on Sunday 24 Nov after the Liturgy, only 5 minutes long, to change the Parish Constitution so as to allow members of the Church Council to be Trustees, without personal financial responsibility. Then a 5 minute meeting for Council members to deal with the new situation.

St Martin was a soldier in the Roman Army. As soon as he could, he left to be baptised and became a monk, a disciple of St Hilary of Poitiers. Against his own will be was made Bishop of Tours in central France, venerated as a holy man in his life-time. He died in 397.


OUR GOOD FRIEND Archimandrite PHILIP HALL, after hearing we had raised the cost of St Martin's wrote encouragingly:
