Praise God! St Martin's is now on its journey back to being a real Orthodox church!

A t last we have moved in to this wonderful Temple of God, that we are shortly to call our base for our Christian living, our *Home*!

By 5 November any objections by the public must be received by the (Anglican) Church Commissioners, and I am not aware that any have been raised as yet.

After that I hope that proceedings may prove short, so that we hand over the required amount of money and settle down to, by the will of God, centuries of Orthodox life in St Martin's church.

We have been worshipping here now for some eight weeks. Attendances are up already, due to a number of factors. We can of course accommodate greater

numbers, with people in "distanced" positions to accord with Government rules.

The place alters Sunday by Sunday, with new rugs and other items being installed. A few radiators were put in place recently in the hopes of producing a little warmth. Gradually we shall get the right selection of holy icons.

But naturally it never be "finished". As the spiritual home of an Orthodox parish, it will be added to or slightly changed in this way and that through the future. What we have done now is merely to set out on the journey which, please God, generations to come will continue to enrich.

Praise God we have started. See what ways you personally can help forward this new life in Christ and the Holy Orthodox Faith.



Archangel Michael and the other Bodiless Powers 8 November Troparion and Kontakion

Commanders of the Heavenly Host, we the unworthy beseech you, that through your entreaties you will fortify us, guarding us in the shelter of the wings of your ethereal glory, even as we fervently bow before you crying: "Deliver us from all danger, as Commanders of the Powers on high!"

Chief Commanders of God; ministers of divine glory; guides for men and leadership of the Incorporeal; as Chief Commanders of the Incorporeal, plead for our welfare and for great mercy.

The Entry of the Mother of God into the Temple, 21 November

On this day we celebrate the giving over by her parents of the Holy Virgin aged three to the Temple Priests. According to Tradition, she steps up to St Zacharias without a care in the world, not even saying farewell to St Joachim and St Anna, who joyfully hand her on as their offering. She remains living and working in the Temple to the age of sixteen when she is betrothed to St Joseph, and then miraculously conceives Christ our God in her womb.

In this way, the feast very happily becomes an introduction to all the story and teaching of the Christian Gospel. It also teaches us a number of different things about the Gospel. It reminds us of the blessing we receive for ourselves when we acknowledge the sense that we each have a calling from God and that we must put Christ first in our Christian family life. It tells of the blessedness of purity, and the joy of heartfelt devotion.

We will keep the feast a day late, on Sunday 22 November.

Church Council Meeting

The Council met briefly affer the Holy Liturgy and agreed the following resolutions:

- 1. That this Council approves the payment of £150,000 from the Parish No.2 Account (the Appeal Account) to the Church Commissioners to purchase St Martin's Church, for use as the parish church.
- That this Council agrees the renaming of the parish with the Archbishop's approval

as The Orthodox Parish of St Martin and St Helen, Colchester, to come into effect on the completion of the purchase of St Martin's Church, and will inform the Charity Commissioners of this decision, and other official bodies such as its bankers.

These matters were agreed early so that immediately they are needed the new names of our parish charity etc can be used.
