On Sunday 19 September His Eminence Archbishop SILOUAN, our Sayedna, presided at Mattins and served Hierarchical Liturgy, ordaining MARK SHILLAKER Subdeacon and then Deacon. The ceremony was largely co-ordinated by Fr ALEXANDER HAIG Junior, and the Choir was directed by MARGARET HAIG. The feast was organised by SUSANNA and MARIOS LINGI and supplied by many excellent cooks. All went extremely well, and we are grateful to those concerned. y ordination on the 19th of September (the feast of St Theodore of Tarsus) was without doubt one of the most wonderful days of my life. To receive this great honour through the laying on of hands by His Eminence Metropolitan Silouan in the presence of so many dear friends, my beloved wife (now Diakonissa) Paula, my mother and members of my family makes me profoundly happy and proud.

However, I am mindful that being ordained a Deacon in the Orthodox Church, while it is certainly a happy event, is also something of the utmost gravity and significance. When all the celebrations, good wishes, generous gifts and delicious food are distant memories, what remains is the realisation that a deacon, like all the orders of clergy in Holy Orthodoxy, exists first and foremost to serve. In fact, the word 'deacon' - from the Greek; *Diakonos* (διάκονος) - *literally* means 'servant'.

In Sayedna's homily on the day of the ordination, he preached that we each have to carry our cross in life, whatever it may be; a difficult relationship, our health or career, our financial or domestic situation, and he was careful to point out that my diaconate will certainly be a

cross for me to bear.

This means that my old life as a lay person is over; that I must now work even harder to follow Christ and carry the cross of my vocation with faith, patience, hope, joy and love to carry the Good News of Christ's resurrection to His Church and into the world. I have so much to learn and will be continuing my academic studies as I work even more closely with Father Alexander, find my feet in the Divine Services and work out my ministry in the parish & local community more widely; I will undoubtedly make many mistakes and here ask for your forgiveness.

I know that I will never stop learning and I am truly humbled by the faith and trust that Sayedna Silouan, Father Alexander and the other clergy within the archdiocese, responsible for selection of candidates for ordination, have shown in me. Please pray for Diakonissa Paula and me, the unprofitable servant, as we continue to pray for you all.

#### Parish's 2020 Statistics reflect Covid restrictions

An examination of the registers for 2020 shows we had no adult or child Baptisms, no Chrismations, no Marriages, and only 2 Funerals. These were closely connected with Covid problems. So too our general Sunday attendances - what was permitted by

the Government or by our Bishop. Sunday attendances were greatly affected too. On 14 Sundays only "closed" services with 2 or 3 allowed to be present, in the house or St Helen's 22 Sundays had an average of 38, sometimes the people outside.

There were no services at all on 2 Sundays. On 15 Sundays from September we were able to worship in St Martin's, "socially distant" from each other, with an average attendance of 46. The numbers attending increased considerably as the year went on. [This tendency continued into 2020 and will be reflected in next year's figures.]

## A Word from the Fathers: St Bede the Venerable (+ 735)

While King Edwin hesitated to accept the word of God at [St] Paulinus' preaching, he used to sit alone for hours, deliberating what he should so, and what religion he should follow.

On one of these occasions, the man of God came to him and laying his right hand on his head (a sign Edwin had seen foretold in a vision) enquired of him whether he remembered this sign.

The King trembled, and would have fallen at his feet, but Paulinus raised him, and said in a friendly voice: 'God has helped you to escape from the hands of the enemies whom you feared, and it is through his bounty that you have received the kingdom that you desired.

Accept the faith and keep the commands of him who has delivered you from all your earthly troubles, and raised you to the glory of an earthly kingdom. If you will henceforward obey his will, which he reveals to you through me, he will save you from the everlasting doom of the wicked, and give you a place in his eternal kingdom in heaven.'
