His Eminence blesses Colchester

his Parish has certainly been blessed by the second official I visit of our Father and Metropolitan His Eminence Archbishop John of Europe.

We had a beautiful Holy Week and Pascha in the wider, though bitterly cold, spaces of St Martin's Church. Then on Bright Wednesday the Archbishop came to preside at Mattins and to serve the Holy Liturgy in this wonderful church.

He was accompanied by Deacon Parthenios. A good number of our friends attended to help us along, and we much appreciated their presence. Among them were Fr Anthony Bardsley (Mettingham, Suffolk), Frs Michael Stokes and Michael Rear (RC), Adn Malcolm Lesiter, Cty Cllr Therese Higgins, and Srs Anastasia and Theodosia from the Monastery, the latter of whom translated into English the Arabic used by the Archbishop when English failed him.

Apologies received included Metropolitan Kallistos, Frs Andrew Phillips (St John's), Raphael Armour (Cambridge), and Alexander Tefft (St Botolph's), Dn Andrew Bond (Mettingham), and Cllr Henry Spyvee.

The Archbishop tonsured as Readers Paul Brighton-Cross (mainly for our Mission at Basildon) and Alex Haig (mainly for a parish at Winchester due to open shortly). Our congratulations to them: both are candidates for the Diaconate and Priesthood.

It was altogether a lovely occasion, and the fact that the service was in St Martin's seemed to speak of hope and blessing. It was sad that more of our own people could not be present, but it was understandably difficult being on a working day.

The food served in the north aisle afterwards was excellent and ample. Our thanks to Helen Lawrence and Sylvia Lefley, who had charge of it, and to all who contributed. There were several Paschal specialities from different countries and they all added to the joy of the occasion.

Margaret Haig was in charge of the music (as she was through Holy Week and Pascha), and it was all of a high standard.

I want to thank all who contributed in their various ways to the success of our fortnight at St Martin's, from removers and carpet-layers to

cleaners, caterers and flower-arrangers, and including a number of students, who worked hard for us.

Now, God bless you all. May the light of our peace-creating festivals of the holy season and the strengthening visit of our beloved Archbishop bring us peace and joy. Father Alexander Christ is risen!

St Martin's continued from page 1 we felt we could pay per year, £3,000.

In addition to the rent, we would have of course to pay for heating and lighting, cleaning etc, and the costs of running the Parish we already incur.

Plus we would have to pay for the installation of the heating and lighting systems, hearing aid system, and CCTV.

Plus the cost of fitting out the building for Orthodox worship.

Plus the cost of insurance. Plus. plus. plus.....

We failed to understand how they could expect us to find the the great crowd of about 240 £10,000 minimum they were asking for annual rent.

Of course, we cannot say we have not been here before, but it was a great disappointment. We have certainly had the support of a large group of

The matter will now be debated at the Parish Council meeting early in May.

The Council may well decide that we had stated that this was our final bid, and that we must keep to it.

Certainly many of us are tired to the nth degree of aborted negotiations with the Trust.

What a disappointment for us and all our Parish, which would have so benefitted from St Martins' Church!

But also, what a disappointment for St Martin's Church, which would have so benefitted from the constant worship and atmosphere of the life of the **Orthodox Parish!**

Alas for us! Alas for St Martin's!

We know how it felt to use it for its proper consecrated purpose of worship over this Holy Week and Pascha, how we 'fitted' that beautiful and holy temple. We experienced people who came to worship at at our Easter night service.

It remains to be seen what the Council will decide to do, but it will not be an easy decision. It will be a sad, and soul-stretching occasion if we decide that we cannot proceed with the matter, but it may well be a necessary heart-break.

May whatever is decided be to the greater glory of God and the good of his Holy Church and people.

God help us. St Martin the Merciful, Bishop of Tours, and St Helen, Equal-to-the-Apostles, pray to God for us!

A Word from the Fathers: The Ascension of Christ into heaven

oday Jesus Christ our Lord went up to heaven: let our hearts go with him. ... Christ is now raised above the heavens; but he still experiences on earth whatever sufferings we his members feel. ...

Why then do we not exert ourselves on earth so as to be happy with him already in heaven, through the faith, hope, and charity which unite us with him?

Christ, while in heaven, is also with us; and we, while on earth, are also with him. He is with us in his Godhead and his power and his

love; and we, though we cannot be with him in Godhead as he is with us, can be with him in our love. our love for him.

He did not leave heaven when he came down to us from heaven; and he did not leave us when he ascended to heaven again.

His own words show that he was in heaven while he was here: 'No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man who is in heaven.
