St Helen's is 200m. down behind the George Hotel in the High Street, but accessible from there only on foot. By car: leave Middleborough Roundabout (between dual carriageways Westway and Balkerne Hill), to Northgate; go straight along St Peter Street to Castle Park; continue round, up into Maidenburgh Street. Nunns Road NCP is the nearest car park.

Three splendid Holy Places to pray

Orthodox faithful love to go on pilgrimage, either to places associated with a particular Saint or especially to their relics. Sadly, in Britain we have few relics left: nearly all were destroyed at the Protestant Reformation. But we still have lots of places associated with the many Orthodox Saints of this country. In May and June this year there are three Orthodox Pilgrimages we can join in Essex and Suffolk.



BARKING is on the western edge of the old county of Essex, just 8 miles from the City of London. There St Erkenwald, later Bishop of London, founded a Monastery in the 7th century for his sister St Ethelburga. Numbers of other Saints including St Hildelitha are linked to Barking Abbey. The picture here shows the ruins of the mediaeval church, now a lovely park. Saturday 16 May 12.30-4.30 pm. There will be prayers, and a talk given by Fr Philip Hall from Lincoln parish. Bring a packed lunch. Drinks available.



BRADWELL-ON-SEA is on the opposite edge, the eastern sea-board of Essex. There St Cedd, the Apostle of Essex, built this impressive chapel in 654, now standing alone on the sea-wall. It became the centre for the evangelisation of the East Saxons, and roots for the life of the Church in these parts grew strong here, one of the oldest Christian buildings England. St Cedd died in the Monastery he founded at Lastingham up in Yorkshire. Monks from here went to be with him—and all died there, except one boy! Bank Holiday Monday 25 May, 2.00 pm. A service will be sung to St Cedd, followed at 3.30 pm by refreshments at the nearby Othona Community. This Pilgrimage is organised by Mettingham parish.



IKEN is a remote church near the east coast of Suffolk, St Botolph settled here in 654, to live the monastic life and fight with demons. The mediaeval church is set above a large creek stretching inland from the sea, and is distinguished by having a thatched roof. Inside, there is a part of a Saxon Cross, perhaps dating to the time of the Saint. Saturday 27 June 12 noon. There will be an Akathist to St Botolph. This also is organised by Mettingham parish.

A Word from the Fathers: St Augustine of Hippo (+430)

oday Jesus Christ our Lord went up to heaven: let our hearts go up with him.

Listen to the words of St Paul: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.

Just as he ascended without leaving us, so too we are already with him in heaven, although his promises have not yet been fulfilled in our bodies.

Christ is now raised above the heavens; but he still experiences on earth whatever sufferings we his members feel. He showed that this is true when he called out from heaven: Saul, Saul,

why do you persecute me? And: I was thirsty and you gave me drink.

Why then do we not exert ourselves on earth so as to be happy with him already in heaven through the faith, hope and charity which unite us with him?

Christ, while in heaven, is also with us; and we, while on earth, are also with him. He is with us in his godhead and his power and his love; and we, though we cannot be with in godhead as he is with us, can be with him in our love, our love for him....

He came down from heaven, then, in mercy; and it is he alone who has ascended, since we are in him through grace.



This icon of SS Constantine & Helen is a prized possession of the Borough of Colchester, and is kept in the Mavor's Parlour.

Their joint feast of course is 21 May. This year that day is also Ascension Day, a major feast of the Church. So we shan't be able to celebrate it properly this time.

But I am sure we are all delighted that we have the patronage of Empress St Helen, who did so much for the Christian Church in the fourth century, and who gave birth to and brought up the celebrated Emperor St Constantine the Great.

The ancient tradition that they were both born in Colchester and that St Helen herself built our church, St Helen's Chapel, is not well known in the West or the East, but was certainly believed for very many centuries.

Still she stands guard over Colchester from the top of the Town Hall, and the Mayor wears her icon on a gold disk on the chain of office.
