The nearest car park is Nunns Road NCP, off St Peter's Street.


CHURCH COUNCIL: The Church Council meets on Sunday 7 June at 1.00 pm.

'BEST KEPT SECRET ABOUT COLCHESTER?' asked the Colchester Gazette recently. KAREN TAYLOR, who I presume is a Gazette reporter, returned the following brief and to-the-point answer to the above question:

"St Helena Chapel. Just step inside the door and you'll see why."

It is good that St Helen's is appreciated outside our own Orthodox community. We know of course that many tourists and local residents do come in, a few regularly. They receive something from their visit, even if some would not call it a religious experience, let alone an experience of God.

PILGRIMAGE TO IKEN: Don't forget the pilgrimage to Iken in Suffolk (about an hour's drive from Colchester) on Saturday 27 June. This is in honour of St Botolph who founded a Holy Monastery there in 654, and consecrated the area by his prayers. The ancient church features a thatched roof, and contains a piece of a Cross going back to Saxon times. But it is the memory of the much-loved Botolph, who earlier spent a period in our Essex, which draws us. Sadly of course there and fish also on Saturdays and Sundays.



SS Peter and Paul are the chief Apostles—in spite of the fact that Paul was not one of the Twelve. They both were martyred in Rome in the 60s. Peter was buried on Vatican hill and Paul in St Paul's outside the Walls. Feast: 29 June.
