# We have a Bishop! We have a Father!

We rejoice that after a period of nearly three years we at last have a Bishop again. Our dear Archbishop (with all Europe for his Diocese) was taken from us to become Patriarch JOHN X of Antioch and All the East, head of the Church of Antioch.

Now on 24 June the Holy Synod, meeting in Balamand Holy Monastery in Lebanon, has elected Archimandrite SILOUAN ONER, not only as our Bishop, but as very first Antiochian Metropolitan Archbishop of the British Isles and Ireland.

Born in Latakia, Syria, he is 44 years old, and was trained in electrical engineering. Later, in Thessalonica, he was awarded a PhD in Theology. He now teaches in the Faculty of Theology at Balamand University. As recently as May he was appointed Abbot of the prominent St George's Monastery in the Valley of the Christians in Syria. We are told that speaks Arabic, Greek, and English.

At the time of writing, that is more or less what we know about him, but we naturally expect to learn a lot more in the weeks ahead.


We will doubtless hear quite soon the date of his consecration, probably at Balamand, and the date of his enthronement, probably at St George's Cathedral in London somewhat later.

We assure His Eminence Metropolitan Silouan of a very warm welcome in Colchester and in the whole of Britain and Ireland. We pray for him in his preparation for consecration and election and for his future ministry among us.

May he lead the Antiochian faithful in these far-off Islands in the Western Ocean firmly, lovingly, devoutly, in the Way of Jesus Christ. Just as St Theodore came from the Church of Antioch in the seventh century and wonderfully guided the British people in the way of salvation, may his prayers, teaching, and example make Holy Orthodoxy a bright and shining light throughout these lands.

The nearest car park is Nunns Road NCP, off St Peter's Street.



The Transfiguration of Christ is one of the most awe-inspiring events of the Gospel. The Lord takes three of his Disciples up Tabor, 'the Holy Mountain', and is greatly changed before them. They begin to understand his real nature: that he is true God in human flesh. Peter, James and John are overwhelmed. They see Prophets Moses and Elias (summing up the Old Testament). When the vision is over they have to go down again to the ordinary world, and follow Christ through his Crucifixion, but through that they come to the equal glory of the Resurrection. All this is displayed in the icon. Liturgy 6 August 9.30am.
